

Bill Schneider, the co-founder of Falcon Publishing, has spent more than 35 years hiking Montana trails.

This is the Cadillac of hiking guides. For each hike there is an elevational profile, brief general description (length, difficulty), trip type, distance, traffic rating, list of USGS maps, starting point, how to get to the trailhead and trailhead facilities. Then there is a detailed description, including camping and fishing. It is illustrated with simple trail maps. These are not big on topography but give you an idea of the layout, trailheads, lakes and peaks. It has abundant, fuzzy black & white photos. 63 hikes are described. Also very good is the section in the introduction that lists the hikes in various categories, such as length and categories like "For photographers" or "For people who wouldn't mind seeing a grizzly bear." I have not yet compared the descriptions to boots on the ground, however, so can't vouch for the accuracy of any descriptions.

This is the best info by far that I've found about this area. Great book to plan your trip although pick up the maps if you're going to hike a lower use trail and compare/study them, it's easy to get turned around on some of the trails. I have this in print form and on the kindle I take when I back pack.

Superb! An all-inclusive guide to a wonderful region of wild America. Lots of good advice. And if you want to be stimulated further to hike in the region, do read Frederick Forsyth's heart-wrenching Indian short story "Whispering Wind" in his "The Veteran".

This is just what I was looking for to help plan a Beaten Path backpacking trip. I have another Falcon Guide book that has several inaccuracies, so I am going to be a little skeptical until I actually try this one out. It seems to be very complete and well worth the money even if it's not perfect. The whole point of this type of book is to get out there and see for yourself what it's like, and this will help me get started.

As a flat-lander living at 600' elevation, having a book that graphically shows the terrain's elevation along with elevation change makes this a valuable resource. I know I'm not going to hike nearly as far at 9000' as I would at 3000' and can more realistically plan my vacation experiences.
