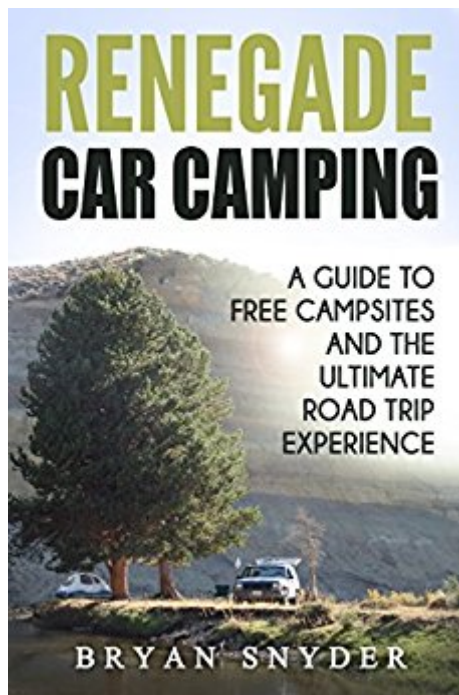




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Renegade Car Camping: A Guide To Free Campsites And The Ultimate Road Trip Experience

This book is long on enthusiasm and short on helpful details. It provides an overview of options for places to spend a free night. Some of them would be useful for people who don't mind having to hide behind a water tower or along a little-used road. Stealth camping in such locations would leave me feeling uneasy, constantly expecting to be disturbed by the landowner, partying teens, sheriffs' deputies out to earn a bonus, or criminals seeking an isolated location to conduct a drug deal. The book does present the possibility of dispersed camping in state and national forests. I have done this a few times. Sometimes, while using these sites, I've had to pay a small fee. I haven't minded parting with \$5 or \$10 to help cover the cost of maintaining the road, the campsite, and at least a minimal amount of fire and police protection. I'm planning to use such sites extensively on an upcoming trip, and I was hoping to find contact information for state and federal jurisdictions that offer such camping, but no such luck. A few other options for a low budget night are covered, including walk-in tent sites, hostels, and couch surfing. While these might be helpful suggestions when the free campsite doesn't appear, their mention didn't improve my knowledge of where to find car campsites. There was a link to a couch surfing website. I joined it and took a look, but I doubt this is an option I'll use. I think I grew out of sleeping in strangers' living rooms some time in my 20s. The book does have an informative section on Leave No Trace ethics. Good information is presented about how to dig a cat hole, although if burying toilet paper is not appropriate, I believe that packing it out is a better option than burning it. I do applaud the suggestion that if you camp in an area, you can create good karma, and maybe good will, by picking up the trash in the area and taking it with you when you leave. Quality of writing and editing are good. I didn't catch any misspellings, grammatical issues, or typographical errors. Since I downloaded a free version of this book, I can say I got more than I paid for. However, I'm still going to have to study a lot of maps and visit a lot of websites to plan my trip.
