Incredible world building! The characters and settings were beautifully written. While I did feel at times the story stretched, I did appreciate the fact that Darkfever was setting the scene for the series, which I absolutely intend to read in full. MacKayla is a reluctant heroine and her development is slow, but that is to be expected. Not only does she have to come to terms with her sister's death, which occurred in a completely different country from her own, but she also has to deal with the fact that she has powers that allow her to see a world that very few knew existed. Jericho Barrons is complex and intoxicating, mentoring MacKayla one minute, then

using her the next. I appreciate the air of mystery surrounding his character, and admit it is the main reason I will be reading on. A dark and powerful start to a series I look forward to completing.

I'm planning a trip to Dublin, have been learning a little Gaelic, and am a fan of the Dresden Files by Jim Butcher. I thought I'd try this book as a way to incorporate several interests and the reviews were promising. I am pleased I gave it a try. Having enjoyed the first in the Fever series, but with a long list of books "to read", I'm torn between continuing with the next one or reading the others that have been waiting longer. The story is told first person by the main character, MacKayla Lane. MacKayla (aka "Mac") is a Barbie-doll southern girl whose biggest decision each day is what to wear to coordinate her clothes, shoes, and nail polish. That changes when her sister is murdered while studying abroad in Dublin. When the police decide there is nothing more to go on, Mac is not satisfied with their decision to close the case. Instead, she travels to Dublin to put pressure on the local police and do a bit of sleuthing herself. She soon learns that her sister and herself are not what they seemed and a world of light and dark faeries exist where no one is looking. With elements of humor, suspense, mystery, and a dash of sexual tension, the author tells the tale of a smart, stubborn young woman that learns to accept and finally embrace her new identity and purpose.

I've been waiting for this book to go on sale and it finally did. I really like the spunkiness of the authors writing, the wit. Love hearing the southern hospitality in this character and developing situations around that. This isn't a book to fly through because of the detail and the authors writing style. I want to know what is Barron, what was in her journal, about her parents and so much more. Can't wait for next book.

Yes, I was hooked on this Fever series from reading the 1st book, Darkfever, the first books by Karen Marie Moning were her Highlanders series....which had the time-bending travel, paranormal romance theme, and based in Scotland.....some sexual scenes but the Fever series does have more explicit sexual scenes with the same paranormal theme but based in Irelandabout a sister who is searching for who killed her sister, Alina, while attending the University in Dublin. The book flips from first person "in the moment" to first person "telling a story" which took away from mystery, character, & was inconsistent. Will I buy the next book? eh, probably not but I will look into other Karen Marie Moning books that appeal to me more.

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
