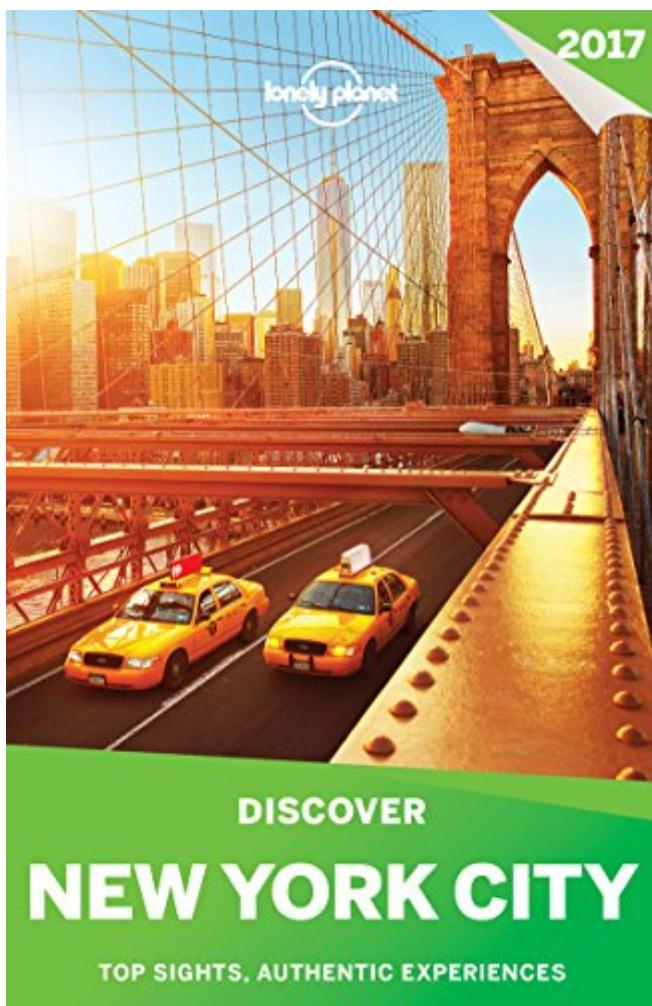

I ordered this book as an update to an Unofficial Guide to New York City I bought (and was very happy with) about 5 years ago. I've heard good things about Lonely Planet, so was excited to read this one.I was so disappointed. There are no details about things that really matter to travelers. For

example, the lodging section is only 3 pages long -- there are no details on top rated hotels, best ways to book, etc.; all it includes are broad locations where you can stay (e.g. Midtown, Upper East Side, etc.). Very unhelpful! There was also a summary of the "top sites", each about 3 pages, and with no insight that you couldn't find online (e.g. best times to go, best ways to avoid lines, possible discounts, etc.). And one inaccuracy: there was a list of the "Best Broadway Shows" and Hamilton wasn't on the list! I loved the show, but even being objective, it's won TONS of awards, more so than Chicago (one of the listed "best" shows). There was information about Hamilton, but it made me suspicious about the objectivity of the authors to rank a long-running show above one of the most awarded Broadway shows ever. When we travel to Europe we use Rick Steves' books, and we had a great book for our trip to Disney World, so perhaps my expectations are too high, but I don't think many people would find value in this book.

Must read for anyone that wants the inside scoop on where to go in New York City and surrounding areas.
