

Excellent book

This is an honest account of a young infantry lieutenant's Viet Nam era Army experience. He begins by describing his somewhat frustrating training period serving under a demanding, yet competent CO, who was committed to the belief that he could execute his orders in country, and still bring all of his men back alive. Though there is plenty of action and suspense, this is not primarily a blood-and-guts story. The two main themes are how the Company Commander's method of operations played out, and Lt. Babcock's journey, told in anecdotal, diary-like fashion, from being an eager second lieutenant to a seasoned leader of men. His passion for both country and brothers-in-arms comes through loud and clear. As a Marine lieutenant in Viet Nam myself who never made it to the bush, I nonetheless identified with his concerns, apprehensions, actions under fire, and ways of dealing with his men. His story could well have been my own.
