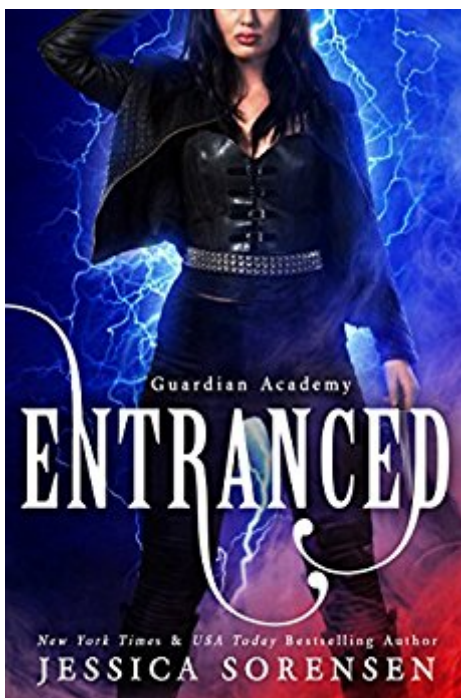


The book was found

The story line was pretty good. What I could not stand is the way it ended. It was way too quick and cut off in the middle of the story. There was literally no close at all...it just cut off. It's just a cheap way to make sure more of the books get bought.

I liked the synopsis for this book but it doesn't feel like a complete book, more like 1/2 or 3/4. There's no resolution of any of the story arcs that have been laid out throughout the series. The major cliff-hanger ending is designed, I'm sure, to get you to buy and read the remainder of the series which is annoying and in my opinion something a good author shouldn't need to do. I noticed no particular spelling or grammatical errors and the story moved along at a decent pace. Though some of the twists/turns are predictable I don't feel like they take away from the story. I liked that Alana seems to be, at this point in the story, a strong female character who isn't without her faults/weaknesses. I'll probably read the next in the series to determine whether I'll continue on with the series.

Spoiler Alert: Alana is a bad ass who is supposed to be what everyone in her family is a keeper instead she gets the mark of a guardian and her grandpa is marked as a traitor. Can't wait for the next installment in this series.

Alana is born into a well known family of keepers. Keepers protect people from all the creatures who go bump in the night... They also hate guardians. So when Alana ends up getting the guardian mark instead of the keeper mark, well she's not too happy. But her new sexy partner Jaxon kinda makes up for it. This book was amazing the story kept you interested, it was humorous and sad at times. The grammar was correct but most of all the book gave you answers without giving too much away. For that reason I'm looking forward to the next book to see what happens to Alana and Jaxon.

The book really was pretty good. I enjoyed the main character. She acted like a real human teenager, not an adult in a teenager's body as so many YA protags do. The world around her is fascinating too and I'm still questioning whether or not Keepers or Guardians are the real "good guys" here. But, admittedly, it feels unfinished. There's TONS of mystery and build up for a big story, but the book ends just when one major mystery is solved, but tons others are not. I wanted a lot more before hitting the end of the book and I worry that book two will not fill those desires.

I kinda liked the world that Sorensen created but I wanted to know more about it. Is there a difference between regular humans and guardians\keepers? Do they live in a completely different world? And if not, how are humans not noticing people with assorted colored eyes, fangs and/or

rotting skin? Also, I'm not grammar Nazi at all, I'm actually pretty terrible at grammar, so if I notice that a sentence is missing a comma or has left out a word then there's a problem. On a good note, I absolutely loved Alana's sass and her chemistry with Jax.

Jessica Sorensen wrote another great series! One page into Entranced I realized that I already read the book, but I still didn't want to stop reading! I'm hoping that the reason I needed to refresh on Entranced is because I soon will be able to read the second Guardian Academy!!

While the plot is not a bad one, I second the comment about it being very similar to Vampire Academy (which was a better read because there was a little more meat to the story and narration). I disliked the superficial, archetypal teenager voice narrating the story, as I think it makes her sound much more young and insecure than I expect the author intended. I read this book in less than 2 hours, so if you want a quick supernatural YA book, give it a shot but don't expect a clear ending....there are other books to check out.

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
