

Synopsis

Dogon cosmology provides a new Rosetta stone for reinterpreting Egyptian hieroglyphs. Provides a new understanding of Egyptian hieroglyphs as scientific symbols based on Dogon cosmological drawings. Use parallels between Dogon and Egyptian word meanings to identify relationships between Dogon myths and modern science. He does a good job at positing alternative views, but does very little in the way to back them up with even sound reasoning. There are countless examples of things like: 3 represents Male and 4 Female and based on modern science showing that X and Y chromosomes have 4 and 3 protrusions, the Dogon must have understood DNA and its molecular composition. The shame here is that he has some fantastic assertions and very interesting ideas; he simply makes claims that I very much want to believe, but have no basis in evidence or science to do so and he does not drape his ideas in anything other than a veil of conjecture.
