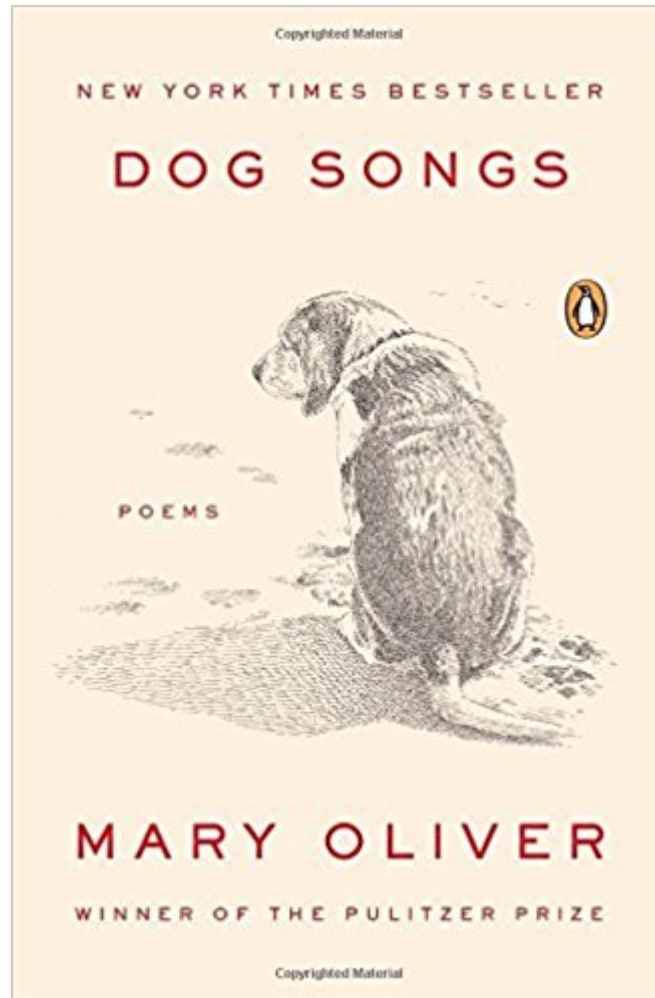




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Dog Songs: Poems

Born in a small town in Ohio, Mary Oliver published her first book of poetry in 1963 at the age of twenty-eight. She currently lives in Florida.

My wife lovvvvvves dogs--and not just our dog (though he gets special royalty status)--AND Mary Oliver. So when I bumped into this book, I knew I had to get it for her right away. And she's delighted with the book. Even I (also a lover of dogs--though less appreciative of poetry) was charmed--and more important--touched by MO's words and the poems in this slim volume (which include both previously published and new works). Mary Oliver is actually one of the few poets who does move me--and obviously I'm not alone. Probably some experts and academics will scoff, but to me she has both a delicacy and down-to-earth quality that offer grace so even someone like myself, who might be a bit tone deaf to the mystery and romance of more obscure works, really sees/listens (

Poetry speaks to me. I like the standard poets, Plath, Heaney, Auden, Housman, Dickinson, and the full canon of must-read-because-you're-an-English-major, Sir Thomas Wyatt, John Donne, John Milton, Percy Shelley. For pure love and enjoyment, I turn to Mary Oliver. When I found out her new

book would be published in October, I pre-ordered it. How could I resist a book named DOG SONGS? I read these poems aloud to my dogs. Oliver reminds us that our dogs live in the moment, but they also feel our emotions. We know when we love a dog that its lifespan will probably be shorter than our own, and we must come to terms with the grief. In this volume, Oliver's poems give the various dogs, some hers, some from the neighborhood, voices. They do speak to us. Her Percy poems (Percy now deceased) are magical. She says, "For often I see his shape in the clouds/and this is/a continual blessing." I look for my dogs in the clouds too. I know this feeling. Other poems celebrate dogs running leash-free, dogs making friends, dogs sharing their finds (dead fish), the dog's adoration of his human: "Percy, meanwhile,/leans against me and gazes up into my face. As though I were just as wonderful/as the perfect moon." If you love a dog, pick up these poems. They will help you celebrate your love, and when that someday comes, grieve the loss. Another favorite line, "Tell me you love me, he says./"Tell me again." Yes, Mary Oliver, I will tell my dogs I love them. And I love you too.

YES! it absolutely did meet my expectations. I have it on my breakfast table and start my day with one of Molly's beautiful poems that speak to my heart in a special way. Even though I am a "cat person" and not especially a "dog person". I have had dogs that I loved and some I have hated having been bitten 3 times and a brute of a dog killed my favorite calico right before my very eyes. I love all of the animals and understand that is nature at work. Don't have much patience with "cat haters" though. And yes, all dogs do go to heaven (Job 12:7-10). . . and kitties too.

This might not be Oliver's strongest collection, but that would be an extremely high standard to meet. At its best, "Dog Poems" is accessible, crisp, and able to reveal depths of meaning with the alacrity and openness which is characteristic of Oliver's most interesting poetry over the years. However, the continuing focus on dogs seems a little cumbersome if one is trying to read the book from cover to cover. Rather, this is a collection to read in snippets, preferably with one's canine companions in sight. Any dog lover will be touched, humored, and excited by this collection at various times. Any longtime reader of Oliver will be glad to re-encounter Percy, of course, and can also look forward to getting to know other dogs and the thoughts they inspire as well. The illustrations deserve to be given attention as well... they catch the expressiveness and godliness of their subjects quite well, and add to the fulfillment offered by this book to anyone who loves dogs, and all that they can teach us.

If you enjoy Mary Oliver's unique poetic style, or if you just love dogs, you'll like this book. Very entertaining, and a quick read as each page is only printed on one side. I enjoyed reading it over several days. A perfect gift for a dog lover.

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
