

Synopsis

Read our customer guide The JPS Hebrew-English TANAKH features the oldest-known complete Hebrew version of the Holy Scriptures, side by side with JPS's renowned English translation. Its well-designed format allows for ease of reading and features clear type, an engaging and efficient two-column format that enables readers to move quickly from one language to another, and an organization that contemporary readers will find familiar. The Hebrew text of this TANAKH is based on the famed Leningrad Codex, the Masoretic text traceable to Aaron ben Moses ben Asher, ca. 930 CE. Ben-Asher researched all available texts to compile an authoritative Bible manuscript. In 1010 CE his work was revised by Samuel ben Jacob, a scribe in Egypt. Lost for centuries, the manuscript was eventually discovered in the mid-nineteenth century and became known as the Leningrad Codex. This edition adapts the latest BHS edition of the Leningrad text by correcting errors and providing modern paragraphing. The English text in this TANAKH is a slightly updated version of the acclaimed 1985 JPS translation. Wherever possible, the results of modern study of the languages and culture of the ancient Near East have been brought to bear on the biblical text, which allows for an English style reflective of the biblical spirit and language rather than of the era of the translation. This edition also includes an informative preface that discusses the history of Bible translation, focusing on the latest JPS English translation of the Holy Scriptures. It is the result of a 30-year interdenominational collaboration of eminent Jewish Bible scholars. Readers are sure to appreciate one of the most intensive projects in the history of The Jewish Publication Society.

The JPS Hebrew-English Tanakh is available in a number of editions; paperback and hardcover, full-size and pocket editions, and in various cover colors and materials.

I very much appreciate this option to read the Hebrew text and English translations side by side. I am a divinity school student and have been taking Introduction to Old Testament/Hebrew Bible. (I also took introductory courses in classical Hebrew, so I have a rudimentary understanding, but not nearly enough to read the text efficiently in Hebrew.) My school has this version of the Tanakh in our chapel, and though I have an English study bible, I found myself going to the chapel to read my assigned readings from this Hebrew-English Tanakh. That way I could brush up on my Hebrew while also doing the English-language readings that were assigned. Finally I bought the book for myself. I have had it for about six weeks. I am really pleased with the quality, and the price on is much more accessible than in stores near me.

The layout of this Tanakh has helped me tremendously to understand the Old Testament in the original Hebrew. Learning Hebrew is not for the faint of heart -- and especially for those of us who have never studied Hebrew in a formal setting -- but reading the English and Hebrew side-by-side makes a challenging endeavor much more approachable.

Easy to read in the Hebrew and the English. Wish it was even easier. Sometimes the JPS crew got a little creative with the English: I wouldn't recommend relying on the English alone, study with a good Hebrew scholar. But many other modern Tanakhs have odd decisions in their English. I'm talking to you, Stone edition. A good size.

Perfect study resource. Having both English and Hebrew on the same page has been helpful in the study of the Hebrew language. Hebrew and English languages written together lends an ease of understanding that might not otherwise be present with only English or Hebrew.

I've been trying to learn to read Hebrew and it is very interesting to actually have a Jewish Bible. I think I will find it very helpful.

This Tanakh sells for \$45 at Boarders and I got it used for \$23 out the door on ! It was listed at used and in good condition and I am very happy with it. I bought this for my personal (spiritual) use as well as an aide in learning Hebrew. I love it on both counts. The translation is good and I love having the Hebrew to see the deeper meaning. On each page there are two columns and the English is on the left and the Hebrew is on the right. (I have since seen the interlinear Bibles with English and Hebrew, one on top of the other and those are more word for word. But I like mine because I REALLY have to know the language.) It does roughly follow line by line but is is not exact...so don't count on just looking opposite on the page for the exact translation. This has all the vowel markings and cantilation marks as well. It can feel a bit small at times. If you have trouble reading small print I'd say to look at some other options or get a good magnifying glass. The names of the books do not have vowel pointing though! One thing I was excited to see what that the Song of Moses in Exodus has been rendered in the 'brick wall' (or what ever you call it?) pattern of the scrolls and not in the columns that the rest of the book is formatted in. There is also another passage that reads like that that I saw as I was flipping though. This is a bit of a bigger book because it has so much in it, but it is not too heavy. I did get a stiff Bible-cover for it to help it not be so floppy (I have a soft cover). This also has the parsha sections listed and other common readings that follow the Jewish calendar. There are no maps. This is very basic, no gobble-dee-goop, and I really like it. I have really enjoyed it and recommend it.
