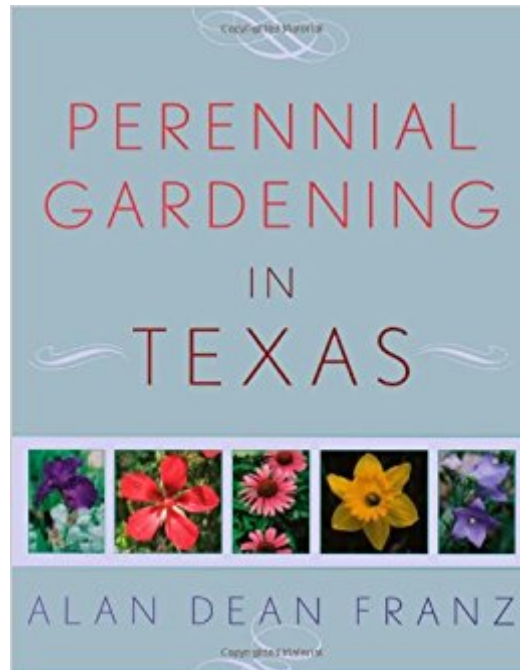

This book is good for planning your landscape and includes layouts and lists by colors, wet, dry, sun, shade, spikey, feathery or flowing, daisy like, and detail lists of individual plants showing characteristics like height, light, soil, and drainage. The only drawback is that the book is not for a specific area of Texas but covers sufficient information for one's own research.

I recently moved to Texas and left a wonderful garden in the pacific northwest. Now I'm starting from scratch in an area I know nothing about. Climate, soil conditions, everything is different. The new property has nothing but spots of weedy grass here and there. I guess I can look at it as a blank slate. This book was exactly what I was looking for. I prefer perennials and this book appears to have the exact information I need to help me start my new gardens and landscaping and lead me to another showcase garden like I used to have. I feel this book will be educational and a great resource and will help me choose exactly what I need that will thrive in my new yard.

The best new gardening book I've seen in a while. Instead of being a repeat of other high-quality Texas books (Native Texas Plants by Wasowski being the best IMO), a large part of the book is devoted to categorizing the plants by their forms (clumping, trailing, climbing, etc.), their preferred habitat (shade, boggy, etc.), by color, and by their ability to attract bees, birds, and other wildlife to your yard. I found these categorizations to be extremely useful. For further information about the plants, you can then look at the alphabetical listing of all the species mentioned in the book. The pictures in Wasowski's book are better, but the categorizations makes this book more useful for selecting plants for your particular landscape.

I love this book. I am new to the gardening world. I always have questions and this book is my go to. I would have loved it even more if the plants were categorized by sun, shade partial shade etc. Very informative book! Pleased!

I read this book before sending to my sister in Texas. The chapters are organized according to basic landscape theory making it very easy to follow for the novice, but information is also useful for any level of expertise. Interesting, useful and educational without being overly technical. Enough design information is included to make it of interest anywhere and many of the plants apply to other areas, especially the "Great Plains" states.
