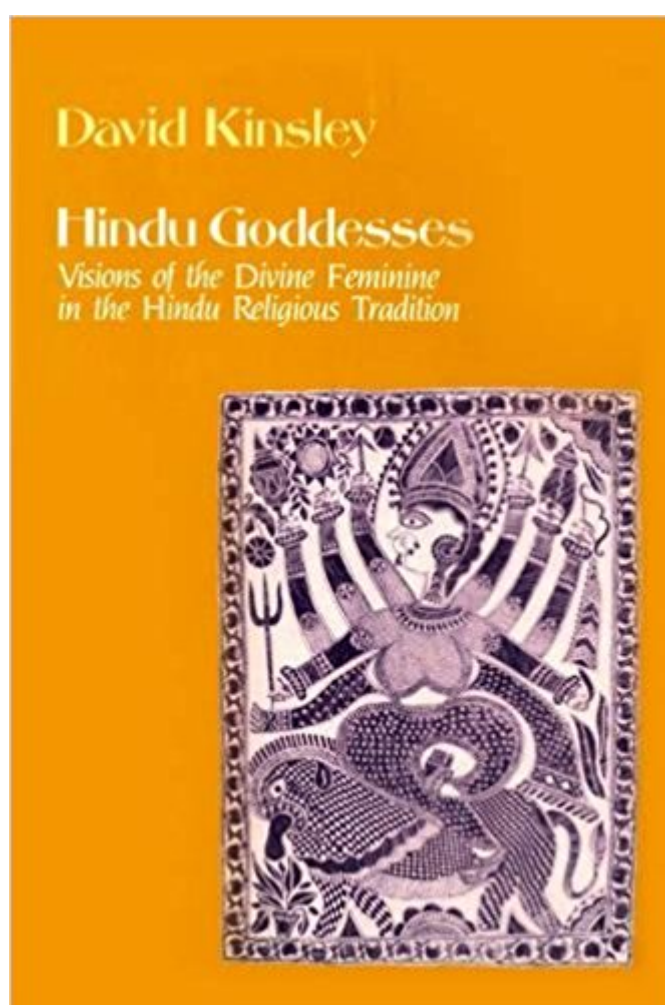


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Hindu Goddesses: Visions Of The Divine Feminine In The Hindu Religious Tradition (Hermeneutics: Studies In The History Of Religions)

This book is very informative but dry and somewhat difficult to read. Being an Indian and a Hindu, I thought it was ok. You can't read more than a chapter at a time.

The book did not make it easy to identify the female deities of the Hindu pantheon. I found other resources that answered my needs, though I had to borrow them from interlibrary loan since they are scholarly books no longer in print.

Great book for one who wants to learn about Hinduism and the feminine within the Indian traditions. Scholarship is excellent, but it isn't for those who have more New Age beliefs in general on goddesses such as Kali or Hindu/eastern concepts in general. I would suggest it for those who are actually into learning about the Hindu religion and not the Western idea of Indian culture and religion.

This is a good book. Whether you are interested as a teacher or student trying to learn more about the Hindu Goddesses, or just curious, this book provides a concise and effective introduction to some of the major Goddesses of Hinduism, as well as background information on classic Hindu scriptures and Gods. The style is academic, but it is also readable. Numerous black and white photos throughout help illustrate the Goddesses of Hinduism. I highly recommend this book.
