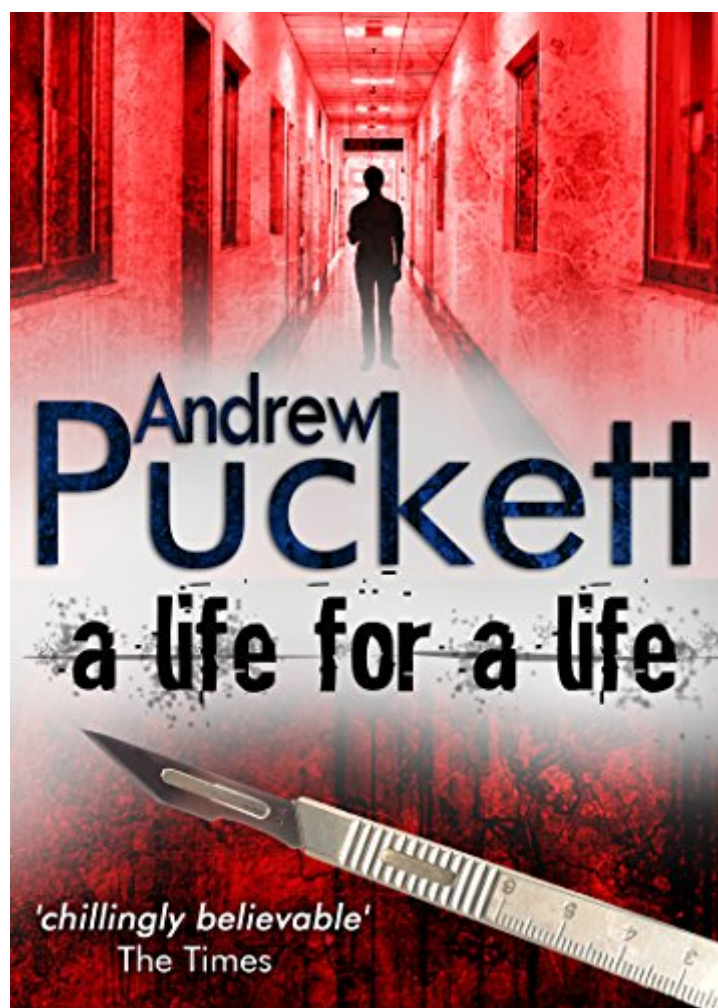


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A Life For A Life

I really enjoyed this medical thriller, reminiscent of a Robin Cook novel. When Frances finds she has Leukemia, she is more than willing to try an experimental drug treatment, Alkovin. Like many of Andrew Puckett's books, *A Life for a Life* is set in the murky underbelly of the health-care services. Puckett worked in this area for many years so he has thorough knowledge of the world he's writing about. The novel is a thriller and a page-turner. I read it in one day, sitting up until two in the morning to finish it. There are plenty of red-herrings and false leads and I was kept guessing until the end. The writing is spare and taut as befits the subject. But Puckett layers the novels with more issues than merely the solution to murder. He touches on the price of ambition, thwarted love, persecution, power and corruption. Most people's lives are a messy mixture of accidents, good and bad decisions, missed opportunities, behavior which is untypical and unplanned. Puckett is really skillful at capturing the chaos of life. The hero of the story takes one step, then another and soon finds himself in a landscape fast turning from marsh to quagmire. But he is not a man for giving up. If you like entertaining, gripping and thought-provoking thrillers then *A Life for A Life* fills the bill.

A Life for a Life by Andrew Puckett has all the elements of a classic crime novel, but with a modern twist. A ruthless murder, an unscrupulous pharmaceutical corporation peddling a so-called wonder drug, a sick woman and her impetuous fiancé, a false arrest, a daring prison break and an unexpected twist in the final pages. But what makes *A Life for a Life* different from the usual formulaic murder mysteries is the shifting points of view and the multiple layers of investigation. Firstly Fraser Callen, the tough Glaswegian doctor and anti-establishment figure, questions his medical superiors about the use of Alkovin in the treatment of leukaemia. Then the baton is passed to Superintendent Garrett and his female sidekick Inspector Lyn Harvey, brought in to investigate the vicious murder Medical Director, Dr John Somersby. Lastly, Department of Health Investigator, Tom Jones, investigates claims of hospital corruption, ably assisted by beautiful lawyer Agnes Croft. The story develops through a series of interlocking flashbacks, the pieces of the puzzle scattered across the pages for the reader to collect and slowly piece together. This technique heightens the suspense, making *A Life for a Life* a real page turner. With a second bloody murder, multiple suspects and a woman's life and sanity hanging in the balance, I rushed to the conclusion. Andrew Puckett has written a fast moving thriller

with an eclectic cast of characters, each one with a possible motive for murder. I challenge anyone to have worked out who did it before the big reveal.

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
